Anti-AAPI Hate

We have looked on in horror as acts of hate continue happening across the nation.

Asian Americans are being targeted, but so are members of the Latinx, immigrant, Black, LGBT+, and religious communities.

Most recently, a major Buddhist temple in Little Tokyo, downtown LA, was partially burned and objects destroyed in what could be another anti-Asian hate crime.

Supporting these victims and their communities is a top priority of LAvsHate and our partners.



Addressing a Critical Need in Protecting Vulnerable County Communities

"I was waiting in line for an appointment with a local senior center to get food. As I waited in line a Caucasian man and woman began cursing at me, telling me to go back to my country, and how immigrants expected everything for free. I grew afraid when the man walked up to me and began to tape this on my cell phone. He punched me in the face and chest and knocked my cell phone out of my hand. He grabbed a rock and pointed it at me, telling me, "I'm going to kill you, fu**ing b****!" No one in line helped me. I ran to the senior center, they wouldn't open the door."

Number of Calls Reporting Hate to 211-LA & Bias Motivation

562 Calls to 211-LA From Jan 1 – Dec. 31, 2020

Bias Motivated Act Reported By Callers	Percent These Hate Acts Were Reported Cumulatively in 2020
Being Called Derogatory Names	<mark>41%</mark>
Threats of Violence	18%
Discriminatory Treatment	<mark>19%</mark>
Physical Assault/Battery	22%
Bias Motivated Bullying *	9%*This was reported at higher % when school was in physical session)
Burglary/Robbery	5%
Sexual Assault	<mark>4.6%</mark>
Graffiti/Vandalism	7%
Hate Mail	<mark>3.9%</mark>
Business Refused Service	2.4%
Attempted Murder	2.4%
Display of Swastika, Cross Burning, Bomb Threat	s Each of these hate acts reported at .007%

LA vs Hate -Services Offered

Everyone who reports hate to 211 is offered free services

HEALING AND HELP:

- Counseling mental health and trauma
- Crime victim compensation
- Legal remedies civil rights and antidiscrimination laws
- Eviction Defense
- To address minors in hate crime, connecting with Children and Family Services

CHANGE: Technical assistance and advocacy to address hate sources

- Change business practices such as training of employees to intervene to stop bias-based harassment; and signage to warn
- Offer services and support to schools where bullying or hate incidents have occurred
- Working with city governments to take action – to support victims of hate, adopt LA vs Hate, create a human relations/human rights agency for community engagement
